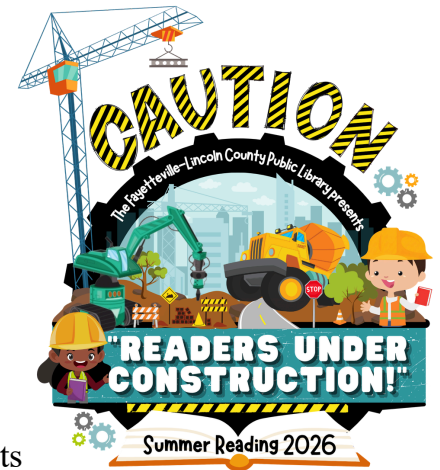


The Fayetteville-Lincoln County Public Library is a vital community resource, serving as a hub for learning, creativity, and connection for all ages. As we prepare for our annual Summer Reading Program, we are inviting community support to help sustain and grow this important initiative. The program runs throughout June and July and encourages reading, supports literacy development, and fosters a lifelong love of learning and reading.



This year's theme, "**Caution! Readers Under Construction,**" highlights how reading and literacy skills are built over a lifetime. With more than 60 programs offered over the summer, the Summer Reading Program welcomes around 200 participants each year and helps bridge literacy and learning gaps through reading and hands-on experiences.

Last summer, the program included 6,300 library visits, 195 registered participants, 1,687 reading hours logged, 4,423 physical books checked out, 5,852 eBooks accessed, and 66 programs offered throughout the season. We are working to make the 2026 program even stronger, but we cannot do it without our community partners.

Strong local support helps bring larger programs to Fayetteville-Lincoln County, including visits from the Adventure Science Center, Hands-On Science Center, Creative Discovery Museum programs, petting zoos, and other family-friendly events.
